## WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY-REG.MEET.-OCTOBER 10, 2012

### 1. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

### 2. PUBLIC PORTION

There was no one from the Public wishing to address the Commission.

### 3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 12, 2012

**MOTION:** A motion was made by Commissioner Hellauer seconded by Commissioner Morse to approve the minutes of the September 12, 2012 meeting with corrections as noted. All were in favor. Motion carried unanimously.

### 4. COMMUNICATIONS

#### A. WPCA COMMISSION UPDATE

Chairman DeAngelis welcomed the two newest Commissioners, Commissioner Donald Ramia and Commissioner Joseph Frolish.

Chairman DeAngelis questioned why Richard Jagers name was still on the list of members of the Board. Mr. Tom Sym stated that his name will remain on the list until his term expires.

#### B. FUND TRANSFER

Commissioner Morse stated that this is because of the sewer usage fees. This will show up on a budget worksheet. We have been working with accounting people upstairs, he added.

#### C. ASST. TO WPCA REPORT

Pete Pavone went over his inspection history report. We logged all the calls that we did. The first page shows all 12 traps. 7 are outdoor traps which 5 passed and 2 failed. There are 5 AGRU’s of which 4 passed and 1 failed. Commissioner Morse questioned what happens if someone fails? You give them 30 day notice for a reinspection, said Commissioner Morse. We are going to send them a letter that we will reinspect said Pete Pavone. Commissioner Morse asked if there were fines imposed. We haven’t as of yet answered Pete Pavone. The permits are up at the end of year, he added.

Mr. Tom Sym stated that if the establishments don't comply by the end of the year that we will be calling Valley Health and they can deal with the non-compliance. Chairman DeAngelis agreed you are better doing it that way.

Before you charge anyone let me plot the grease stated Commissioner Morse. Every month that I plot the grease it shows a steady increase. Early on there was a downward trend to it but now it keeps going up and I don't know why stated Commissioner Morse.

I talked with Ann our DEP counterpart at the State and she told me that we are so far ahead of anyone in the State with the removal. There is no one even close to us, stated Chairman DeAngelis. It was nice to hear that we are ahead of everyone. It is nice hearing it from DEP.

I wanted to tell you, most of the failures on the first page, are from establishments not keeping records stated Pete Pavone. Someone like Ruby Tuesday's, they are pumping every 3 months. We are monitoring them now and I think they may have to go to every 2 months. When I went there and saw everything that had accumulated over a period of 75 days it looked like a lot. I think they should up their pumping stated Pete Pavone. That's a greasy spoon stated Commissioner Hellauer.

How about Liquid Lunch asked Commissioner Morse? Liquid Lunch failed because there was no log records, stated Pete Pavone. That is the one on Research Drive. There are no log records, added Pete Pavone. The Scinto properties are pumping but they keep their own records.

Amici's failed again and no records. They are not showing us any record that they are pumping said Pete Pavone. We found the hotel on Bridgeport Avenue was not pumping, he added. Now they are diligent at keeping records.

Chairman DeAngelis stated anyone not keeping records will find out how severe it will be in 3 months. Especially if they are contacted by Valley Health. Once they keep records like with Ruby Tuesday's you are able to see the difference. That's why we think it would be better for someone like Ruby Tuesday to go to two months, added Pete Pavone.

This report, asked Commissioner Morse, Lori did this? Yes, answered Pete Pavone. Good job, added both Commissioner Morse and Chairman DeAngelis.

### **D. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

Jeff Shortell went over his report. He went over concentration, loadings and compliance. The average of effluent is 3.7. Virgil Lloyd questioned that the average is in the single digitals? Yes answered Jeff Shortell. That is really good stated Virgil Lloyd. Averages under and in the single digitals, he added.

Chairman DeAngelis questioned did you guys decide not to take any SBR's down this year? No we have to leave that in there answered Jeff Shortell. The tank is too full. We are scheduled to start emptying SBR # 1 on Friday October 12 stated Jeff Shortell. When the tank is down to about a foot of liquid on or about October 15 MCVAC will start emptying the tank. Let's go back to page 2 stated Chairman DeAngelis and read those all in a row.

Chairman DeAngelis stated you are all set with Staffing and Safety, he asked Jeff Shortell. And Garritt what did you do asked Chairman DeAngelis? Garritt finished the course for Operation and Maintenance of Waste Water Collection, said Jeff Shortell. A one day course asked Chairman DeAngelis. No it is a Sacramento Course stated Garritt Ogden.

Chemicals, stated Chairman DeAngelis. Jeff Shortell stated that we use everything on the list. Matt Jermine stated that it should actually say September not August, for the heading of Actual Amount Used. It is for the current month, he questioned? Yes answered Jeff Shortell. It should say August. Commissioner Morse stated the Sodium hypochlorate will end in September.

Jeff Shortell read the numbers for grease removal and stated that this September, 2012, total was 560 lbs. and last year, September, 2011, total was 890 lbs. Those are real numbers that are very impressive stated Chairman DeAngelis.

Pete Pavone said you have to remember what came online too. One month the numbers went low and the next month it went up really high said Jeff Shortell. Chairman DeAngelis asked that when they check these numbers over the next couple of readings check to see if they are consistent and the numbers are right. Especially with Route 8 upper and lower stations. Next month when I plot the grease I will see if it goes up stated Commissioner Morse.

Chairman DeAngelis said Jeff, page 3. Let's do the SBR tanks. Ed Comboni said we had a complaint that is not listed. It was an odor complaint at Enterprise Rent-A-Car. They have a car wash and a drain that an odor was coming from. We changed the filter and there is no issue now. When did this happen asked Chairman DeAngelis? A couple of weeks ago stated Ed Comboni. It really should have been on this list, added Chairman DeAngelis.

Jeff Shortell reported that there was a high water alarm at the River Road Pump Station. The # 1 pump relay was being activated by 2 ½ amp fuse that was causing chatter and would blow the fuse. We put in a 3 amp and it corrected one problem. Aaron Associates will be visiting on Friday to diagnose the problem.

Jeff Shortell reported that Aaron Associates and Canfield Electric are working on installing the ORP. Fuss & O'Neill are also overseeing this. The readings then will be in real time. This will help us perform more efficiently with regard to loading.

Jeff Shortell reported that #1 SBR tank is scheduled to be emptied on Friday, October 12. When the tank is down to having about a foot left MCVAC will start to empty and clean the bottom of the tank. After the tank is cleaned, then Canfield can start to rebuild the #1 Motive Pump. Kovacs then will punch a hole in the tank, added Jeff Shortell.

Jeff Shortell reported that they lost the a/c in the lab which is necessary for keeping the SCADA cool in the MCC room. If not they could lose computer control and not be able to operate. Superior came in and found the unit was low on R22. They brazed the leaks, tested with nitrogen, evacuated to 500 microns and added 3.5 lbs. of R22. When they returned the next day they found the compressor would not start. So the compressor was replaced, added Jeff Shortell.

Commissioner Morse questioned if they will put the 50 h.p. motor and the two impellers in? Yes answered Jeff Shortell. There will be a new water seal also said Commissioner Morse. We need it because you can't tell how much water is bypassing the system, he added. We talked about that last month said Chairman DeAngelis. We are using City water for decanter #3 said Jeff Shortell.

When you are quadrupling your water usage for a year there is something wrong said Commissioner Morse. We have been trying to determine why we are using so much water said Chairman DeAngelis. You don't even know why we are using so much water, he added. I am trying to find out why said Jeff Shortell. We had agreed at our last meeting to put this new system in stated Commissioner Morse. I didn't agree to that other system said Jeff Shortell. You are going to be losing water on both sides of that said Jeff Shortell. That is going to be a nightmare, he added.

I don't even know what this part is no one ran it by me. If the water goes through that tank and filters it through, if you get dirt in there you will lose the seal and then you would need to take the pump out, said Jeff Shortell. We really have to do this said Commissioner Morse. That's what we are working on said Jeff Shortell. We had agreed to do this said Commissioner Morse. If you fill the tank up and release the water, if this doesn't work in a year or so, what then said Chairman DeAngelis. 3 is the next one to come down stated Jeff Shortell.

How close at hand is this other system said Commissioner Morse? Is it available to us he asked? Matt Jermine said you could replace the pump seal now. In 3 months from now it will be retrofitted to the SBR tank. Commissioner Morse said you have to take down the SBR you do the water seal now while everything else is down. We have to clean those tanks every other years said Chairman DeAngelis. Right said Matt Jermine. So that tank will be down in another 2 years, said Chairman DeAngelis.

Matt Jermine said you circulate the city water and you can replace the filter if there is an issue. Jeff Shortell said how do you know when you can use the same water. We will take the pump apart said Chairman DeAngelis. The seal could be all right. Canfield has two seals in Boston said Jeff Shortell.

You will know something is wrong if the pressure drops, said Matt Jermine. It is no walk in the park to change a seal said Jeff Shortell.

There is something wrong if you are waiting to change a seal every 3 years said Commissioner Morse. Was the seal changed on the first tank, asked Chairman DeAngelis? Yes said Jeff Shortell. What is the first tank you took down, asked Chairman DeAngelis.

You have to buy the whole deal said Jeff Shortell. Then buy the whole thing said Commissioner Morse. If you order any parts now you won't have them in two weeks said Jeff Shortell.

It sounds like to me that you can take the tanks down in the future and then add the system said Commissioner Hellauer. You can't use anything but their seal on it said Jeff Shortell. You will put pressure on both sides and then you would have to take the whole thing a part, he added.

Keep going with what you are going to do on Friday but really the next time you guys should figure out what you are going to do said Chairman DeAngelis. I really think you should make a motion to do this said Commissioner Morse. Next SBR that goes down you should make us aware of the scope of the work, he added. When you are taking the next tank down, we will talk about this because I think Steve is right. This is not the first time we are talking about it, he added. Do what you are going to do on Friday when you are ready to do the 3<sup>rd</sup> tank we will discuss this again said Chairman DeAngelis. We need to have that discussion some months prior don't wait until we did this time said Commissioner Morse. It has to be some months prior to that, he added. It should be part of your review he added.

Chairman DeAngelis said we will talk about this in 2 months. So for next month said Commissioner Morse.

Commissioner Morse stated that in your packages you received a nitrogen chart. We had 54 last month and if we keep going this way we will get a big fat check from the State. Chairman DeAngelis said good job, Jeff, Garritt, Ed. This is phenomenal said Chairman DeAngelis.

Commissioner Morse said Tom and I have been working with the people downstairs on this budget worksheet issue. We have made a lot of progress but we are not there yet, he added. We are reviewing last

### **5. OLD BUSINESS**

#### **A. ELECTION OF OFFICERS**

Under the draft provisions of the proposed new chart for the City it is required once new members are seating on a Board, at their first meeting following being appointed, a Chairman and Vice Chairman have to be elected. Based on those requirements, Chairman DeAngelis asked for recommendations for Officers for WPCA. Commissioner Hellauer stated he would like to recommend Michael DeAngelis as Chairman.

**MOTION: A motion was made by Commissioner Hellauer seconded by Commissioner Dognin to elect Commissioner DeAngelis as Chairman of the WPCA. All were in favor. Motion passed unanimously.** Chairman DeAngelis asked as required if there were any other recommendations, 3 times. Hearing none he stated the motion does carry.

Chairman DeAngelis recommended Commissioner Morse be Vice-Chairman.

**MOTION: A motion was made by Commissioner DeAngelis seconded by Commissioner Dognin to elect Commissioner Morse as Vice-Chairman of the WPCA. All were in favor. Motion passed unanimously.** He asked 3 times for any other motions. Hearing none the motion carries.

#### **B. FUSS & O'NEILL STAUS REPORT**

Virgil Lloyd introduced both himself and Matt Jermine as the on-call Engineering Service for the City, to the new members of the Commission. Chairman DeAngelis explained that even though we spent \$14,000,000 on a new plant there are still issues and concerns. Fuss & O'Neill help us with the ongoing conditions at the plant. We do a spread sheet for our long and short term needs. The sheet shows the schedule and the updates once every month said Matt Jermine. This is black and white this month, I felt bad said Matt Jermine, no color.

Commissioner Morse asked that we are going to have 3 blowers. The original plan was to replace just 2 of them answered Matt Jermin. That was the first phase stated Virgil Lloyd. This space is for three more stated Commissioner Morse. You will go from 3 blowers to 5 stated Matt Jermin.

This is the existing blower building stated Matt Jermin. We will take these out and they will be retrofitted and these 2 will be more efficient. Are these free blowing asked Commissioner Dognin? Will they only run when one of these fails asked Commissioner Dognin? There are a few ways to do this stated Matt Jermin. The simplest way is that this will only run when one of these stops, he added. Wouldn't you want to run this if you have these stated Commissioner Dognin? When you first start running you use the most oxygen, then this next tank will aerate and you turn them on and off stated Matt Jermin. The blowers don't have enough capacity to run all the time, he added.

Matt Jermin showed everyone a view of the room and stated that the existing blower is here and here are the spots for the other ones. The air header is overhead, goes out the center of the building and meets up with the existing air header, he added. There is a lot of work laying out what is going into this building, state Matt Jermin. We want to minimize the size of this building.

We retrofitted the blower so that it has a larger silencer and comes out the common air header into the sludge holding tank. When we add air to the sludge holding tank it gets almost like a septic tank of sludge that can be aerated with oxygen stated Matt Jermin.

This is what we agreed to in the DEP consent order to reduce the odor. The benefit when you thicken this is that it is all sludge and instead of ammonia it is nitrite which requires less oxygen, stated Matt Jermin.

How big is the building asked Commissioner Morse? It is 14 by 22 answered Matt Jermin. Realize that you have 3 feet on both sides working clearance and 4 feet in the middle. It is as small as you can get from a cost point of view. We will have a garage door to get the blowers in and out.

We are trying to keep the cost down with regard to getting the power to the building. Do we want to run cable to the building or try to get the power from here stated Matt Jermin?

The SCADA controls how to turn the blowers on and off. If we put a computer in here or run the signals back to the scada then we are still updating that stated Matt Jermin.

That is a prefabricated building questioned Commissioner Morse? Yes stated Matt Jermin. We sent one of the prefabricators out to check on the dimensions. The dimensions are a little larger than the normal prefab buildings he added.

The ceiling clearance right now is tight, stated Matt Jermin. You can open the garage door and have a dolly or something that can slide right out, he added. You can put a rail but the building would need to be taller. It would be easier than trying to get the units out of the existing blower building now, stated Matt Jermin. The center aisle is wide enough to slide this out here stated Matt Jermin.

Jeff Shortell stated what I am worried about is getting the guys in the middle when they are working. I don't want anyone to get hurt, he stated. We will be giving these drawing to the guys stated Virgil Lloyd. Is there room there to change the belts asked Commissioner Morse? Yes, stated Matt Jermin.

You could do a lateral railing stated Commissioner Morse? You can put a cart in there and take the cart out of the garage door, too, he added. I looked at that but the lateral railing has a dimension of 8 inches add another foot for the sliding unit and the unit has to lift a foot so you are talking another 3 feet stated Matt Jermin.

Commissioner Dognin stated here is an idea what about a slab on the outside and two rails for each one on a track coming in and out. The platform on a thing with wheels and axles. The railings could be in concrete. Like a tram way stated Commissioner Dognin. We are going to put a concrete pad in the center stated Matt Jermin. We put them on a dolly now stated Garritt Ogden.

We are on schedule with Aaron to try to get the tank cleaned, stated Matt Jermin. The Engineer came in cost wise less and they did a good job with the upgrade to the SCADA. Kovacs is making good headway.

They are scheduled to go out after the tank is cleaned out. We want to make sure they measure right for the rebar. Last time we didn't look so they could have done the wrong tank, stated Garritt Ogden.

Matt Jermine stated that on the needs chart what has been done and upgraded is now in gray. On the last page as a long term need I put the replacement of the copper pipes in the plant, he added.

In our assignment sheet there is our billing schedule and update. Nice job stated Chairman DeAngelis and Commissioner Morse.

Chairman DeAngelis asked Virgil and Matt if they were all set with the system and monitoring of all the sewer sheds. You got information from Maguire, right, asked Chairman DeAngelis? We did once stated Matt Jermine. Can you give us an update next month because we have had a few new applications come in stated Chairman DeAngelis. The sewer shed capacity added Chairman DeAngelis. The small ones are not monitored that much right said Chairman DeAngelis.

#### **6B. BLUE HERON COVE**

Peter Hughes for the applicant addressed the Commission. This is the property located at 550 River Road, near the River Road Pump Station. There is a current driveway and there will be an easement through that to get to the units.

This will be a development of 36 units, duplexes and triplexes. They are 3 bedroom units, full walkout from the basements and a total of 108 bedrooms.

This is a low pressure line stated Peter Hughes. We will be putting a new manhole on the River Road.

Chairman DeAngelis questioned what capacity are in those wet wells? During the course of the past year with power outages we have had people not being able to flush the toilets. What is the capacity for those?

Peter Hughes answered these are duplex units 36 by 84. In my daytime job we had 184 pumps lose power for 7 days. We had to go out every 3 days stated Peter Hughes. The town did stated Chairman DeAngelis. That has been the problem in my mind he added. You can run a generator but it is not enough power to kick on the grinder pump, added Peter Hughes. The town went in to pump that he added. In the emergency we sent a letter that you fill the tub with water the night before and we will be out the next day to pump. All of the pumps had emergency generators, he added. That is something that an association does asked Chairman DeAngelis? Yes, answered Peter Hughes.

END OF SIDE 1B AT 8:45 P.M.

Commissioner Morse questioned they will be responsible for getting a hauler? Yes they will have that be part of the association documents stated Peter Hughes. Will you make sure we get a copy of that stated Chairman DeAngelis? Yes stated Peter Hughes. I would like our Engineer to get that information so that is part of the package, stated Chairman DeAngelis.

Matt Jermine asked if the duplex grinder serves one building? It will be the building stated Peter Hughes. It will be a common circuit, added Peter Hughes.

Commissioner Dognin asked how many units will be in each building. There will be triplex and duplex units, stated Peter Hughes.

The pump station uses an easement and there is a well outside the easement. We will extend City Water to you and abandon that well, stated Peter Hughes.

We have been asked to have a second egress and extend the driveway connecting to your driveway. If you have to come down that 12% grade at night this would be great for any large piece of equipment, stated Peter Hughes.

I have been out here since April and there is no odor stated Peter Hughes. Stay on the grease he added.

There is a manhole that when we built this there was a private developer who was going to build another line from the pump station to the forced main, stated Mr. Tom Sym, You look at that manhole it is an inverted one. They might have put in some piping or gravity said Mr. Tom Sym. If they went by the culverts we will be very happy stated Peter Hughes.

Mr. Tom Sym stated I don't know what you will use as your average flows? Peter Hughes said I am assuming 210 gallons per 3 bedroom units.

There is a snap shot and profile stated Mr. Tom Sym. We need more information on that, he added.

Virgil and Matt will be calling you up, he said to Peter Hughes, to go over numbers stated Mr. Tom Sym.

#### **6C. SEWER ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Mr. Tom Sym stated that we extended the \$60,000. 00 from Phase 2 for more lining. There are a couple of lines that are over 100 years old, he added. There are cracks all the way through on Wharf Street. There is a big hole in that line, this thing is cracked all the way through, stated Mr. Tom Sym, They agreed to do all of these lines and hold their price. We will come up about \$4000.00 short and take this amount out of the Sinking Fund. We will get this all done then.

Chairman DeAngelis asked was this oblong? Yes answered Mr. Tom Sym and it is cracked from the inside. These pipes are from 1906 and Maltby Street has pipes from 1935, added Mr. Tom Sym.

We are going to call DEP stated Mr. Tom Sym. When the pipe is badly damaged it is a blown lining that is fiber glass or epoxy stated Chairman DeAngelis. What is the mill or strength on this, he asked? It looks like tomorrow it will collapse. The lining on Long Hill was 3/8 of an inch stated Commissioner Dognin.

When we did the ones on Center Street we had the problem with the back-up views. We found a pipe that we had to take out because if something like that collapses it takes out the whole system, stated Mr. Tom Sym.

How many feet are you recommending, stated Chairman DeAngelis? 800 feet answered Mr. Tom Sym. It will cost approximately \$4000.00, he added.

What % of the 100 year pipe asked Commissioner Morse? 10% stated Mr. Tom Sym. Considering all we have done so far not even 10% added Mr. Tom Sym. We should make a decision to do them all stated Commissioner Morse. It does depend on how bad they are and if there are roots in there stated Mr. Tom Sym.

DEP is not requiring you to do this asked Chairman DeAngelis? They want us to be on some sort of maintenance program stated Mr. Tom Sym. They want us to look at these pipes, he added. They are not requiring you to do 100% of those pipes stated Chairman DeAngelis. The DEP will review these videos, added Mr. Tom Sym.

Can they get the instrument in there to do the laterals asked Commissioner Dognin? We can switch down to the half size stated Mr. Tom Sym.

Next year with our budget we can start charging more money to treat the sewers, the commercial guys that send more waste to the plant than the people who are home at night stated Chairman DeAngelis. It is in the ordinance stated Mr. Tom Sym, There is the ability to charge, he added. If we are going to raise rates on the individuals we should raise rates on the commercial.
